The Baltic Energy Council (BEC) is founded to ensure the continuation of the work of the project »Public Energy Alternatives« PEA, funded by the European Union within the Baltic Sea Region Programme 2007 – 2013. Within this project several institutions such as public bodies and universities came together to elaborate strategies and action plans on how to promote the economical and ecologically sustainable and affordable production and distribution of energies from renewable sources. To continue the work of the project and to make use of the project's findings and results in the broader BSR area the Baltic Energy Council is founded. The tasks and aims of the Council are:

- to serve as a consultant and information service for all interested public organisations in the BSR region and municipalities (and beyond)
- to provide information on energy related issues, especially to provide expert knowledge
- to support the exchange of expert knowledge, know-how and experiences on a transnational level
- to support its members and other interested parties in conducting energy projects
- to become an expert network for the whole Baltic Sea Region

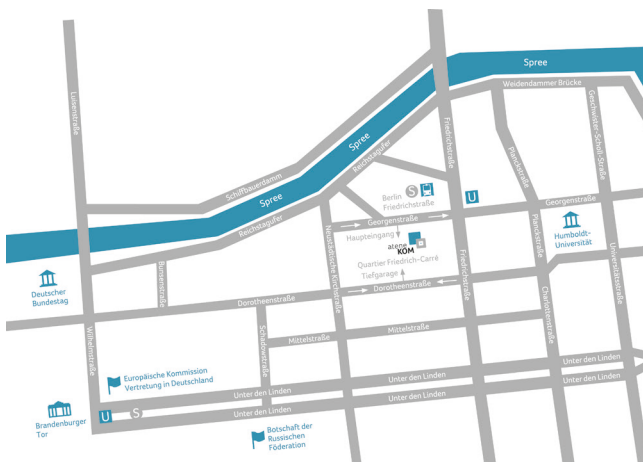
